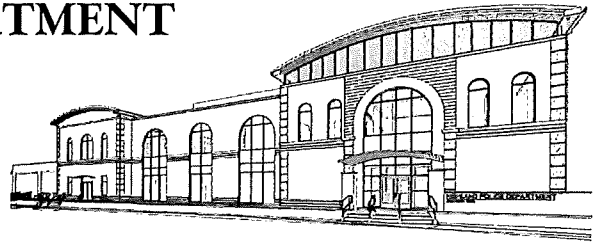

Approval was given to forward claims to the Town Council for payment.

On a motion by Commissioner Moes and seconded by Commissioner Danko the Commission on a viva voce vote approved the resignation of Records Clerk Holly Severson effective 9-27-19.

He also stated the Health Insurance had an 8% increase for next year.

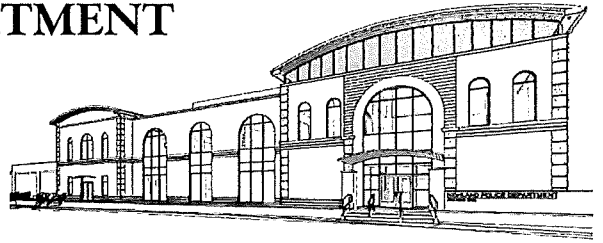
