

CELEBRATING 75 YEARS

Although technically known as a semi-sesquicentennial, Parks Superintendent Alex Brown is simply calling the town's 75th celebration of parks and recreation a party and is inviting everyone to attend.

"This is a special anniversary we want people to enjoy; that 75 years ago, a forward-thinking council put a priority on parks."

As the longest-serving superintendent of the 200-acre park system that is home to 23 unique green spaces, Brown is proud of what has been created.

"I credit a staff that is dedicated to upgrading what we have and adding to a growing roster of programs created for the enjoyment of residents," he said. "We're excited to celebrate 75 years of parks and recreation!"

Police chief Pete Hojnicki said VIPS provide a vital service to the town.

"VIPS do jobs that free up officers," he said. "We are always looking for individuals, like Stan Wrobel, to expand the ranks of the unit."
