Minutes: Request for a motion to approve minutes of the last meeting held February 16, 2023.

Old Business:

a. <u>Board Member Terms</u>: On 1/27/23, Council President Tom Black appointed Jim Colias Board Chairperson on recommendation of the board. Although Natalie Stromberg of the High School Sustainability Club expressed interest, her application to the board has not been received. Teacher/Sponsor Heather Oaks was asked to recruit another sophomore or junior student. Elizabeth Herrejon serves until her successor is appointed.

b. <u>CommuniTree Spring 2023 Plantings</u>: Funding for the CommuniTree Grant Program is made possible through a Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Grant awarded to the Northwestern Indiana Regional Planning Commission by the USDA Forest Service. On 2/28/23, Highland's application for twenty Spring 2023 tree plantings was submitted to NIRPC – 50% low growing and 50% medium growing species. Included were planting locations in Brentwood Subdivision identified by Blane Roberts where homeowners pledged to plant and water trees in their front yards where there are utility conflicts or insufficient space in parkways. A tree planting & care workshop and tree pick up date will be determined April 2023.

c. <u>Transplanting Trees</u>: The weather is now too cold to transplant more Jackowski nursery trees. We will plan to replace dead trees in parkways, street medians, Merkley School; and plant new trees requested by Elizabeth Herrejon and Bernie Zemen in the Spring.

d. <u>Tree Health Seminar</u>: A March 29 at 6:30 pm session is scheduled at Highland Library for a presentation by Arborist Sharon Anderson about "Preparing your trees for Spring and Drought Recovery." Following the presentation, Sharon will be available for questions regarding tree care. Registration is required because space is limited. Contact the Library at 219-838-2394 to reserve your seat. *On the date this agenda was prepared, notice of this seminar had not been posted on the tree board's page on Town's website.*

e. <u>Tree classes for Elementary Students</u>: Jim Colias is coordinating with Rebecca Koetz, Purdue Lake County Extension Educator, to lead classes on a single day at Our Lady of Grace and Highland Christian School.

f. <u>2022 Tree City USA Application</u>: On 3/6/2023, the Town of Highland received recognition for the fourth consecutive year. A 4'x6' flag, a 2022 Brass Maple Leaf for the plaque in the Town Council Chambers and two "4 Years" Sign Stickers were received.

g. <u>2023 Arbor Day Event</u>: Jim Colias will report on work in progress for Highland's April 28, 2023 Arbor Day Event at Highland Christian School. State Representative Mike Andrade and Council President Tom Black accepted a speaker invitations, a proclamation has been prepared by Clerk-Treasurer Mark Herak, the Indiana Department of Forestry Nursery offered to provide a Shingle Oak Tree for campus planting and Pecan seedlings for distribution to the 3rd graders.

New Business:

a. <u>Update Board Action Plan</u>: The Board will review, change and potentially approve the Draft 2023 Action Plan.

- 4. Update Unapproved / Approved Species List with photos of recommended tree species Assigned to Jackowski (Last done for unapproved species 9/6/22).
- 5. From the approximately dozen Jackowski nursery trees, secure utility locates and replace dead trees at Merkley School, in parkways and street medians; plant new trees in yard locations requested by Elizabeth Herrejon and Bernie Zemen Assigned to a weekend crew consisting of Jackowski, Underkofler, Roberts, Zemen and Colias with truck.
- 6. Identify streets where there are open planting sites due to removal of dead trees; then survey the homeowners to inquire if they are willing to water and care for a replacement tree Assigned to Roberts as lead with Roback for survey.
- 7. Decide on events in which we will participate to acquaint the community of our endeavors, identify homeowner planting sites, recruit volunteers: Park Pride Day, Farmer's Market, Fourth of July Festival, Fall Festival Assigned to Roback as Lead.
- 8. Maintain community partnerships with Parks, Public Works, Schools, Town Council, NIRPC, NIPSCO, Chamber of Commerce & Highland Businesses Assigned to Roberts as Lead.
- 9. Apply for available grants and keep a running tally of trees that we procure Assigned to Underkofler.

- 14. Periodic review of ordinances that need updating Assigned to Underkofler
- 15. Secure 1-2 speakers per year for educational sessions on pertinent topics Assigned to Colias.
- 16. Annual idea sharing, new ideas to keep Board moving forward All Board Members.
- 17. Establish a list of goals/accomplishments/key facts and publish in a media release to Gazebo Express, NWI Times and WJOB Assigned to Underkofler.
- 18. Review the Action Plan and make any adjustments to assure commitment to goals and objectives of plan for the next year Assigned to Underkofler.
- 19. Renew application for Tree City USA before December 31 Assigned to Underkofler.
- b. <u>Endorse Grant Applications of Highland Neighbors for Sustainability and Highland Community Foundation</u>: Jean Bernius (Cell 715-240-0444) is writing two grant applications. One is a \$5,000 NIPSCO Environmental Action Grant to acquire native seeds; the other is a \$50,000 T-Mobile Small Town Beautification Grant to fund a native prairie engineering firm, Stantec, to drill the seeds into the thatch after the town prepares project sites along the Erie Lackawanna Bike Trail.
