## **NEW FENCE WILL ENHANCE** MAIN SQUARE PARK

Construction of a permanent fence surrounding Main Square Park is planned to be completed in time for this year's Fourth of July festivities.

**Parks Superintendent Alex Brown** said the fencing made of panels of aluminum spindles between smooth brick columns will replace the orange snow fencing that park crews installed for big events.

The enclosure will have an oversized gate to allow vehicle access for set up, pedestrian gates on the west and north and easy access from the parking lot at the northwest corner of the park near the playground.

"Indiana Excise always requires fencing because of the beer garden," Brown Said.

"This is going to be an attractive addition to the park – and to Highland," he said. "This presents new options for decorating for events and the holidays with the permanent structure."

## HIGHLAND POLICE CALL ON COMMUNITY TO RAISE FUNDS FOR NEW ANIMAL SHELTER

The Police Department is launching an all-hands-on-deck fundraising campaign. The goal: \$300,000 to fund construction of a new short-term housing facility for strays and lost pets.

Shawn Anderson, administrative commander for the Highland Police, is appealing to the public to help.

"At 52 years old, the building that houses animals has long outlived its useful life," Anderson said. "We need the public's help to build a new one"

The new Animal Control Shelter will be built in partnership with Munster just south of the current building. The plan is to expand its footprint from 15 feet by 15 feet to 15 feet by 30 feet.

Last year, the facility cared for 98 dogs – 83 from Highland and 15 from Munster.
